WHEN OUR WORLD IS SHAKEN

At this time of the year the Scripture readings and the prayers invite us to focus on the "end times". Texts of Scripture are selected from the apocalyptic writings of the Bible. These are books, which concentrate on what God will do to bring an age, or era, to a conclusion. They also describe typical human responses to situations of upheaval and massive change: fear, faith, awareness, spiritual blindness, repentance, hardness of heart etc. The writing is necessarily obscure and mysterious. The descriptions are symbolic so as to be applicable to all times and situations. The Bible is as true here as anywhere else. The Bible is always true because it is revealing our truth – the truth of God's relationship to us and our relationship to God.

When we read apocalyptic literature we are tempted to ask when and how. We want to know specific dates. Perhaps the origin of such questions is the attitude that I will only worry about it if it is going to happen in my lifetime. If it is not happening in my lifetime I can forget about it. The point is, it will happen in our lifetime. It happens in everyone's life. Our task in prayer and meditation is to discern how the symbols apply to our life and times. What is beginning and what is ending in our life; what is growing and what is decaying? What movements of culture are working in harmony with God

and what is working contrary to the way of Jesus? The changes and insecurities of the world may arouse fear. What is my fear saying to me? Can I identify where I have invested my hope and trust? Am I really trusting in God? Do I need to let go of things that are not helping the growth of God's kingdom among us?

Am I prepared to witness to Jesus? Am I ready to rely on the help of the Holy Spirit? Am I prepared for the negative reaction of people who are close to me? They may not understand the faith I have. They may not be ready for the choices I have to make. Also I may not be ready for the choices they have to make. Am I receiving all the peace that Jesus is offering? Do I experience a growing calm, trust and determination to endure? Can I share this peace and fortitude with others?

These are the kinds of questions we can bring before God in prayer. God can and will take away our fear and strengthen us to persevere even when following Jesus is unpopular. We will discern which movements can be trusted and which must be rejected. The kingdom of God can only be within us and among us, in the blessings of love and friendship that God gives. (DMA)
