New Lectionaries The Church in England and Wales are bringing out a new set of Lectionaries, this means new books and translations will come into effect during Advent 2024. They will be beautifully published but there is a cost. We need two sets, one for St. Michael's and one for St. Bernard's. Each set will come to the total of £1170.77. Donors are welcome to sponsor a set of books. Your name will appear in the book as a sponsor should you so wish. If you would like to purchase the entire set for the church, please speak to Father Innaiah ASAP.

I hope that everyone is aware of the 10-Year Plan by now for our Diocese of Portsmouth You Will Be My Witnesses. The Plan prioritises improving liturgy, formation, and evangelisation leading missionary communities serving all, particularly the young and the poor. It reminds us that we are to be prudent stewards of Christ's Church where structures will need to be reshaped with prudent stewardship of resources and investment in the future. The 87 parishes of the Diocese will become 24 larger parishes working together, sharing resources, and working to an agreed plan for the mission entrusted to us of introducing more people to faith in Jesus Christ. The implementation of the Plan is underway in many places. Clergy and laity have begun work on a Mission Plan and a first draft has been submitted to the Bishop. We have been working on a common approach to First Holy Communion preparation . The clergy continue to meet often providing an opportunity for mutual support and collaborative working. https://www.portsmouthdiocese.org.uk/ you-will-be-my-witnesses . Ordinary Time : After the weeks of Lent and Eastertide, the Church now moves on into that period of the Liturgical Year known as 'Ordinary Time', the Sundays and weekdays *per annum*. The liturgical colour is green, symbolising new life and hope. The overall purpose of this season is to contemplate the life and teaching of Christ and the salvation He has won for us. The Sunday readings this year belong to Cycle B and are mostly from St. Mark. The weekday readings follow Year Two of the Lectionary Cycle. During much of history, Ordinary Time was referred to as the 'Season after Epiphany' and the 'Season after Pentecost.'

It was only in 1969 when the new Liturgical Calendar took effect after the Second Vatican Council that the term 'Ordinary Time' came into common use in the liturgical calendar. It got its name not because it is ordinary or non-exceptional – how can any time after the Resurrection be deemed ordinary?! - but because it is ordered




or numbered time, derived from ordinal numbers (first, second, third, etc.). The season continues now until the First Sunday of Advent, 1st December. The last Sunday is celebrated as the Solemnity of Christ the King.

During this season let us pray that God will direct all our actions so that we may abound in good works.

This Sunday, 26th May, the first Sunday after Pentecost, is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity.

Many of us clergy will say it is not an easy feast day to preach about. The truth about God is so beautiful and so simple – there are Three Persons in One God – but to explain this and to unpack its meaning for people today is challenging. Part of the challenge is not falling into heresy! To me, this day is a loud proclamation to the world that God exists and that God is Love. He shews us the depths of His love in the Mystery of His inner life as Three Persons in One: the Father, the Son and

the Holy Spirit. In the third, fourth and fifth centuries, the Church gave much thought to the exact nature of the Godhead. Many synods and councils were called to establish and promulgate the true faith of the Church, what Christ had revealed, and to defend that faith against error. Most of the errors of those days however seem to resurface time and again

in Church history. But the great defender of orthodoxy, St. Athanasius (d. 373), the Bishop of Alexandria, expressed the truth of faith perfectly. An extract from one of his letters is given in the Office of Readings for Trinity Sunday. You can read it here. St. Athanasius is also attributed with writing a Creed, "The Athanasian Creed" or Quicumque Vult, which proclaims the truth about the Triune God. Why not say this prayer

on Sunday?
