The implementation of the Plan is underway in many places. Clergy and laity have begun work on a Mission Plan and a first draft has been submitted to the Bishop. We have been working on a common approach to First Holy Communion preparation . Say a prayer this week for all who died and for those who fought, and also for those currently serving in our armed forces; their sacrifices and their service enable the freedoms we enjoy today.
