The 15th Sunday of the Year

Father Paul writes......

In our Old Testament reading this weekend, we meet Amos the prophet. Like all prophets, he was called by God and his task was to be sent to the Northern Kingdom of Israel. He lived around 800 years before the birth of Jesus.

During Amos's day, the land we know now as Israel/Palestine was divided into two kingdoms. There was the northern one, called Israel, under King Jeroboam II and the southern one called Judah, under King Uzziah. Under King Solomon, King David's son, the two parts were united but after Solomon's death they split apart.

Amos lived in the Southern Kingdom of Judah at Tekoa, just south of Jerusalem on the border with the Judean desert. He was a shepherd and a dresser of sycamore trees. In the time of Amos, sycamores were fig trees. Amos's job was to prick the fruit on the tree, and this made them grow fatter and sweeter

At the Lord's command, Amos left his quiet and idyllic life and home to travel north to the shrine at Bethel, where he was to proclaim his prophetic message. There were two shrines in the Northern Kingdom, one was at Dan – now close to the border with Lebanon – and the other was at Bethel. Bethel was the one favoured by King Jeroboam II and was, therefore, the royal sanctuary. Both Bethel and Dan were shrines dedicated to images of golden calves which represented the pagan god Baal. This was clearly against the Law of Moses and the worship practice in the Temple in Jerusalem.

Amos's task was to announce to the king, his priest Amaziah and all the followers of Baal, that they were seriously mistaken in their worship, which they had acquired from surrounding and threatening nations like Assyria. The worship of Baal acted as a kind of insurance policy to keep the potential invading force at bay. Amos met opposition from Amaziah because his message would upset the king and the status quo which he wanted to maintain. At the same time, Amaziah would not have taken seriously a sycamore dresser and shepherd from somewhere south of Jerusalem on the desert border. But Amos was relentless and persevering in his message, condemning as he did, the worship of idols and the exploitation of the poor and the lavish living of the rich, which followed from the worship of Baal.

The question Amos might ask us is this: "What are the false gods which are worshipped in our own time and lead to excessive luxury for the rich and the oppression of the poor?"


